


STOP, DROP *and* ROLL!




Hi Kids! I'm State Fire Marshal Goodwin. Do you know what to do if your clothes catch on fire? Cover your face, drop to the ground or floor and roll over and over until the flames are gone. Make sure you practice this and show the grown-ups at home how to do it too!

DROP!




ROLL!

GROWN-UPS: Ask kids to demonstrate "Stop, Drop and Roll." Remind them to cover their face and to continue rolling until the fire is out. Remember this works for adults as well. Also, explain to kids that if they do not stop and drop quickly the flames may get larger and the fire will spread.

Home ESCAPE PLAN

Hi Kids! I'm State Fire Marshal Goodwin. Look for two ways to escape a fire in each room of this house. Circle the first way out in red and the second way out in blue. Then circle or draw a meeting place outside the house. Now practice your home escape plan with your family.



GROWN-UPS: Draw a map of your home. Draw the rooms, doors and windows that go outside. Draw your smoke alarms. Pick a safe meeting place outside in front of the home. Talk with your family about the plan. Show your children what to do and explain that once outside at the meeting place, no one should go back inside, even for a pet or another family member. Call 911 from outside and wait for the fire department.
